SUBJECT: Update on Honors Burial to the BOD

On Tuesday, March 11, 2025, Doug Nunes and I attended the University of Denver to listen to a readout of the findings of Professor Carol Helstosky's class on Veteran Biographies. Her class of 29 students we assigned two veterans each to investigate and develop biographies for.

Over the course of two hours, the students provided their investigative findings. All documentation, after review and grading by Professor Helstosky will be transmitted to me in electronic format. All of this data will be entered into the following databases; Find-A-Grave, Veteran's Legacy Memorial, and More than a Headstone.

Of the 160 names on our veteran listing (those investigated and approved for burial), 280 had already been investigated by Professor Helstosky's previous classes. Her class worked on 58 of the remaining veterans to develop their biographies.

My intent is to find a way to publish this information in a booklet form as a reference of our commitment and work to honor those that have gone before us.

Our current group of veterans will be honored in mid to late May of this year

Today we Honor one of our own:

TIMOTHY M TUCKER BRANCH OF SERVICE: U S AIR FORCE RANK: CAPT,

STATUS: MIA

DATE OF BIRTH: March 16th, 1946, DATE OF CASUALTY: December 24th 1971

HOME OF RECORD: LAS ANIMAS, Colo

1LT Timothy M. Tucker was the pilot and 1LT William R. Finn the co-pilot of a North American Rockwell OV-10A Bronco (#67-14667) assigned a mission over Laos on Christmas Eve, 1971. Their mission took them over Attopeu Province in the extreme southeast of Laos. At a point about twelve miles south of the city of Attopeu, the Bronco was lost, and Tucker and Finn became Missing in Action. Upon subsequent evaluation of their cases, it was thought doubtful that the enemy knew either of their fates. In 1973, the prisoners of war held in Vietnam were released. Laos was not part of the Paris agreement which ended American involvement in Indochina. No prisoners held by the Lao were ever released.

1LT Tucker was an OV-10 Forward Air Controller stationed at Pleiku AB, RVN. Lt Tucker and his friend, Lt Finn, were scheduled to fly the next to last sortie Christmas Eve, 1971. Lt Tucker requested that he and Bill fly the last sortie and watch the Christmas Eve fireworks over the Ho Chi Minh Trail in Laos. They did not come back. All the FACs at Pleiku flew max hours for the next 6 days searching for them, all to no avail. It is believed that they may have found the crash site at one of the heaviest defended sites in our area, but photos analyzed by 7th AF did not seem to support the crash site theory. Both men are still considered MIA's
